- Called to order 6:41 pm by Lisa Gray
- FINANCIAL REPORT: budget reviewed and financial report reviewed. No questions. Unanimously approved.
- SECRETARY REPORT: Minutes from January meeting presented. Lisa Gray proposed to approve minutes. Jeannine Rotzler seconded the motion. Minutes unanimously approved.
- COMMITTEE REPORTS:
 - Spirit nights: Famous Toastry was successful. (\$385) Donations taken to FOHA. Next month Squisitos and Shakes in May Both will collect for kKds helping Kids
 - Reflections: Ava Loh won dance choreography in hunt district, 3rd place in state. Dr. Woolever will have this announced

 - SEAC: Dr. Woolever reported: ukeuro mats are being used (strategically placed) and staff has been trained. Avoids hand on contact in a situation.
 - Musical: Rehearsals going well. Setting up the senior show and princess party shows.
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- NOMINATION COMMITTEE: will be comprised of Kim Mendoza, Jeannine Rotzler, Lisa Gray. Lisa Gray will be committee chair. Board positions will be posted and nominations will be presented at the meeting next month. Voting will occur at May Meeting. All positions are available.
- PRINCIPAL REPORT:
 - large parent turnout for parent coffee (50 parents) to discuss MAP results. Percentile: we want above 50%. 0-25 is red light. 25-50 yellow light. May need some help.
 - Above 50: doing well and good level of readiness. There is engagement data. Not uncommon to see a dip in the middle of the score. The data is used to determine need for intervention. Teachers than set goals for growth which seems to help the kids take it more seriously.
 - Taken 2-8 grade.
 - A longer report is available from math and reading teachers if requested.
 - Parent question: how is math test done as kids are in all different level classes.

- It is assessment of students compared to LCPS and nation, not what class they are currently taking.
 - MAP testing adapts until the student plateaus.
 - Parent question: what SOL do kids take: math and reading for 6 and 7, 5 SOL in 8th grade
 - Requirements starting for class of 2023 are changing and will be less SOLs.
