FACTS ABOUT SEUSSICAL JR.:

- Seussical Debuted in 2000. It won a Tony in 2001 and 3 Drama Desk Awards. In 2008 it won 3 Lucille Lortel Awards and a Drama League Award.
- It is MTI's most performed show in America.
- Seussical Jr. is a mashup of 11 different Dr. Seuss books.
- Do you know that Ted Seuss Geisel (Dr. Seuss himself) had terrible stage fright after a time he was 14 yr old and was being pinned as a Boy Scout by President Theodore Roosevelt, who was one pin short for him! Ted never got over it! DON'T BE LIKE TED!
- Dr. Seuss invented the words "nerd" and "Grinch".
- Seussical was not only performed by Stone Bridge High School, but it WON THE CAPPIES for best musical. This was the FIRST time Loudoun County ever took home a Cappie. SBHS then performed parts of Seussical at the Kennedy Center in D.C.
- This is Trailside's 4th musical, but first year as a Theatre Program!
- There will be NO cuts made to the show during auditions.
- Everyone will be in all 6 shows, but may play a different part depending on the night.

Rules of Rehearsal

- 1. Act like an adult, be treated like an adult. Act like a child, be treated like a child.
- 2. Listen when the Director is talking (sometimes she even has good ideas!)
- 3. Be positive, and never make fun of anyone.
- 4. Always give 110%
- 5. No food in the auditorium.
- 6. Be on time! Rehearsals start at 3:30!
- 7. Let us know if you are sick or will not be there, as soon as possible!
- 8. Be a good audience member, no talking while others are performing.
- Leave backpacks (and cellphones) in the back of the house at the start of rehearsal. If you need to use or check your phones or grab something out of your bag let one of the adults know.

Attendance Policy

Please make rehearsals a priority! If you miss, it makes it harder for others to rehearse in your absence. The cast is a team and we can only be strong as one! If you miss something it is YOUR responsibility to get in contact with the director to find out what you missed. You may need to come in on a make up day (typically Friday). <u>Rehearsals</u>

In general Rehearsals will be Tuesday-Thursday with either a makeup day or Tech days on Fridays. Not everyone will be called to every rehearsal so CHECK THE CALENDAR! Starting in March EVERYONE (crew included) will be called Tuesday- Thursday!
